Are there different kinds of development? We'll describe it and, later on, we'll connect it to the population and dynamics that you'll probably find in rural areas.

We will not be the first to act in rural spaces, and European Union has been developing an interesting and large bunch of experiences for the last two decades. We'll show you the method they used and how the developments can be more sustainable, democratic and participatory in the rural spaces. Developing projects together with inhabitants is a challenge and renewable energies appear as a great opportunity to develop not only environmental sustainable projects, but also to build great projects for a social sustainable rural space, putting together environmental and social goals. We'll put the effort in a better rural places to work and live, and building a better planet to preserve for the next generations.
